Police continue to tackle metal theft

The police in Rural Fylde in conjunction with Fylde Borough Council officers will be continuing to target metal theft offenders over the coming months. Officers will be conducting several operations stopping vans and flat bed lorries to check the occupants and their goods. Metal theft is a national problem with thieves mainly targeting lead and copper.

Thefts from buildings also continues to be a problem. St Annes Parish Church at Singleton was targeted recently by thieves who stole lead from the church roof during the night.

Follow this advice to help reduce metal theft:

- Report suspicious activity around buildings. If a crime is in progress please ring the emergency line 999 and other incidents can be reported on the 101 number.
- Avoid leaving anything lying around that could be used to help a thief e.g. ladders.
- Make it difficult for thieves to move stolen goods by storing wheelbarrows and wheelie bins securely.
- Consider anti-vandal paint and property marking.
- Use alternative materials to lead for any repairs - to reduce the risk of becoming a target for thieves.
- Regularly check your roofs so that any theft is found before it rains and further damage is caused.
- Consider installing security lighting, particularly at roof level where metal roof coverings are present.

Speeding tackled in Singleton

PC Hooper and PCSO Rigby conducted operation Pathway in Singleton Village on Wednesday 7 March and issued two fixed penalty tickets for drivers using mobile phones, two tickets for not wearing seatbelts and recorded seven speeding offences in Singleton Village.

Fixed penalty tickets issued

Police and Council officers stopped over 30 vehicles on March 8 in an initiative aimed at tackling metal theft offenders – several individual were issued with fixed penalty tickets for traffic offences.

'Inspiring' teenager named Lancashire Young Citizen of the Year

A teenager who turned his life around to become a role model for others has won the High Sheriff's Young Citizen of the Year Award in recognition of his outstanding achievements.

15-year-old Ashley Thompson, from Blackpool, received his award during a special ceremony at Lancashire Police's headquarters in Hutton.

The High Sheriff of Lancashire's Young Citizen of the Year Awards, sponsored by BAE Systems, take place every year and involve the current High Sheriff Peter Mileham inviting applications to find a young person who has helped either their local neighbourhood, an individual, family member or local organisation.

Ashley won the award after the judges heard about how his life has changed since he joined the Boathouse Project in Blackpool. He first attended when he was 12, due to his disinterest in school and often challenging behaviour. The sessions enabled him to see the opportunities available to him and he progressed through the project to become a young leader. Among his many responsibilities, he currently chairs the project's youth council meeting, tasks other attendees and delivers sessions to children aged between five and ten.
